COMPREHENSIVE CARE COORDINATION

Support for individuals age 60 and older and their caregivers. A Comprehensive Care Coordinator can meet with you to:

- Complete a comprehensive assessment
- Provide Information on options available to meet your needs
- Arrange for services
- Make changes in services as needed
- Answer your questions
- SHIP, Medicare, LIS, Medicaid

CHOICES FOR CARE

Information for individuals who are considering nursing home placement:

- Information on nursing home care
- Information about options to nursing home care, including services available at home
- Help with returning home after going to a nursing home

COMMUNITY CARE PROGRAM (CCP)

Services available through the Illinois Department on Aging:

- Adult Day Services
- Homemaker
- Volunteer Money Management
- Emergency Home Response
- Transportation

ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Help for adults 18 and over who are victims of financial exploitation, physical abuse, emotional abuse, neglect, or sexual abuse:

- Case Managers work with the older adult to help determine what services are most appropriate to stop the abuse
- All information is kept confidential; reporter's names are not released

FAMILY CAREGIVER SERVICES

Support for caregivers of older adults and grandparents and older adults raising children under the age of 18:

- A Comprehensive Care Coordinator will assess needs and set up services
- Counseling in your home
- Caregiver support groups
- Help in the home to give caregivers a break

LONG TERM CARE OMBUDSMAN

Support and advocacy for residents of nursing homes and assisted living facilities:

- Protect and promote the rights and quality of life for people who reside in long term care facilities
 - Resolve resident complaints
 - Provide information and answer questions
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
